Located in the heart of the nation's capital, two blocks from the White House, the Willard InterContinental has hosted almost every US president since Franklin Pierce in 1853 and was the site where statesman Henry Clay introduced the Mint Julep outside Kentucky. The bourbon-based cocktail is now the Round Bar's signature drink. A gracious stay, The Willard features 335 elegantly appointed guest rooms with a unique mix of contemporary luxury and historic charm.
